Latest C of C update June 13th

The straight section where the potholes have been filled has really settled down nice and firm so no need to use a vibrator plate to firm them up. Activity around the bale storage area is generally a bit messy with loose wet straw and a bit mud. The northern end of the Peri track has got quite gown up with grass down the middle but should run down with the passage of stage set up vehicles, if not the early runners will flatten it.

The pictures give you an idea of conditions and if you compare with the earlier ones from April it shows just how things change with nature. Just to remind crews you only have to put two wheels on the overgrown grass at side of stage to allow another vehicle past and he will do the same. Don't go right into the thick of the grass unless you have broken down.

There will be odd large cones around the stage and for a reason so don't go taking them out.

To try and give you an idea of tyre choice I have broken down venue in percentage terms:

20% Very good concrete.

30% Loose material on top of concrete/muddy wet straw.

35% Cracked concrete with grass growing through.

15% Well weathered concrete again with grass growing through.















23rd April 2014

Update on the forthcoming Wolds Rally to be held on Ludford airfield from C of C Mick Smith. All stages are over 5mile in length.

The venue surface is all concrete some sections well weathered. Most of the perimeter tracks are wide enough to allow overtaking but you will be putting two wheels on grass covered concrete so drivers be aware.

There are a few potholes along one short stretch due to that part of the venue being used by HGV's to collect straw bales for power stations, thousands of them stored on land within the venue. Part of Mablethorpe Motor Club's agreement with the landowner is for all holes to be filled level with stone or similar material prior to the event.
